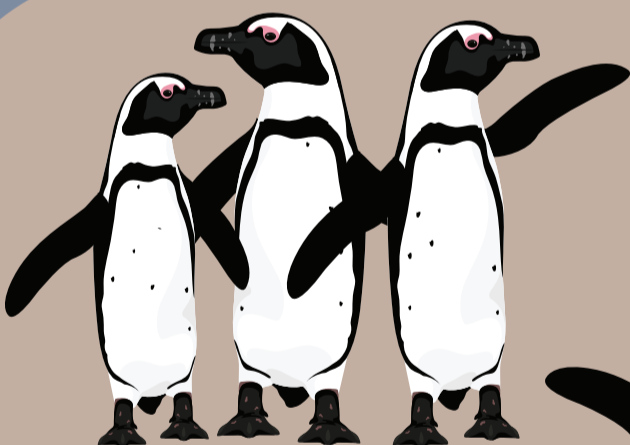

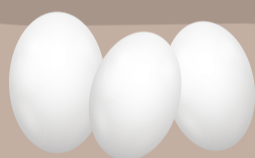

ON LAND PENGUINS WADDLE AND HOP.

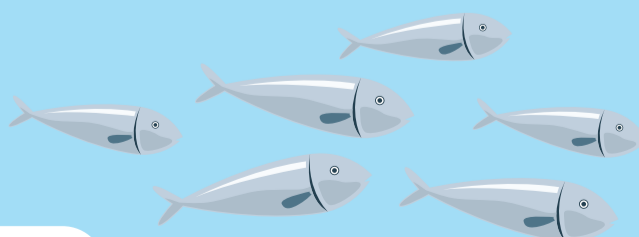


I sound like a donkey braying!

THE SOUND A PENGUIN MAKES IS CALLED A HONK.



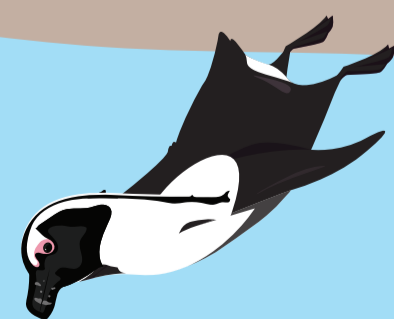
THEY CAN DIVE UNDERWATER FOR UP TO 4.5 MINUTES TO DEPTHS OF MORE THAN 100M
